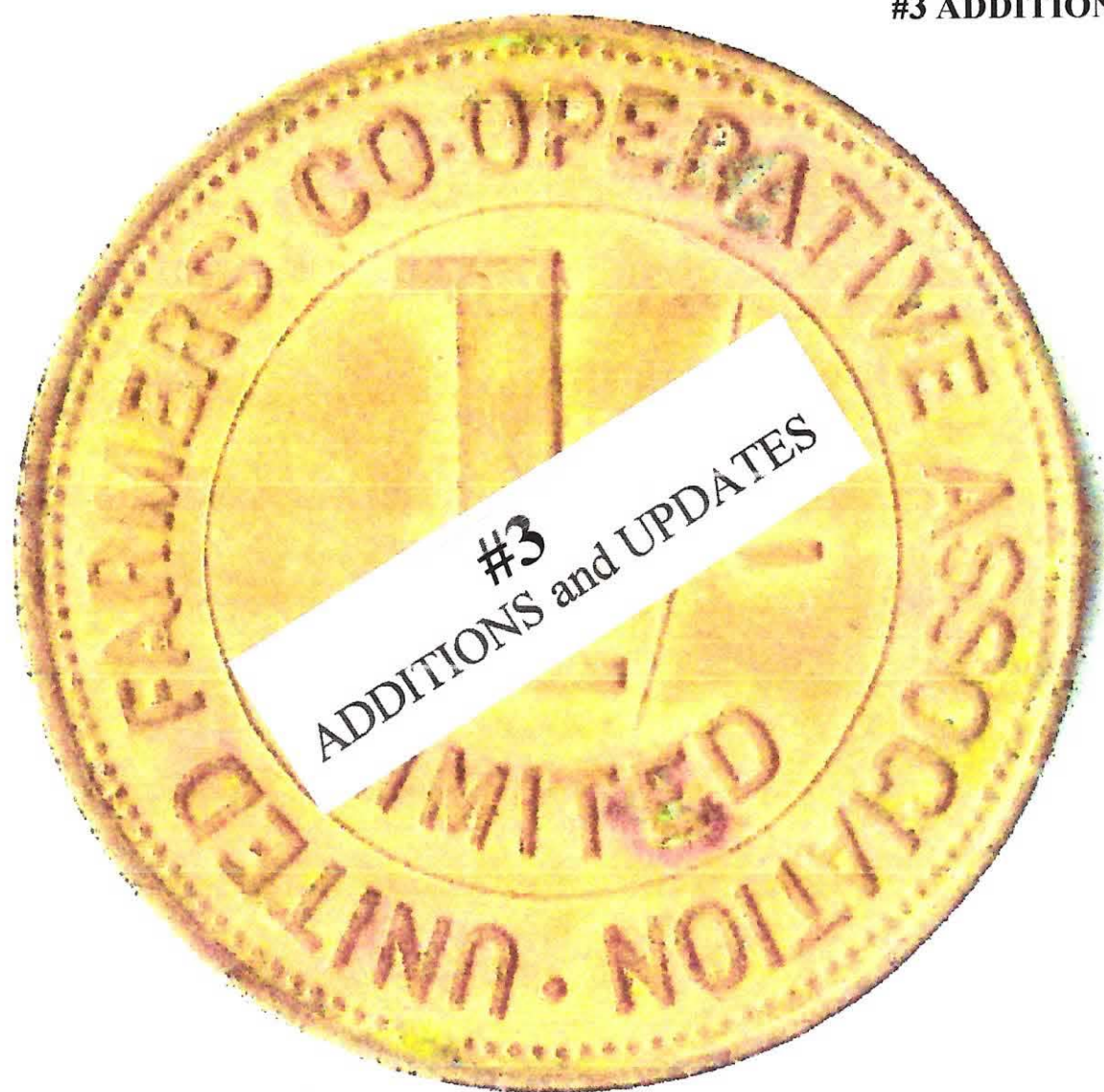

# Lyttelton, New Zealand

---

**Lyttelton** (Māori: *Ōhinehou*) is a port town on the north shore of Lyttelton Harbour, at the northwestern end of Banks Peninsula and close to Christchurch, on the eastern coast of the South Island of New Zealand. According to the 2013 census, Lyttelton (including the neighbouring communities of Rapaki, Cass Bay and Corsair Bay) had a usual resident population of 2,859.

As a landing point for Christchurch-bound seafarers, Lyttelton has historically been regarded as the "Gateway to Canterbury" for colonial settlers. Until the 2020 coronavirus pandemic, the port has been a regular destination for cruise ships. It is the South Island's principal goods-transport terminal, handling 34% of exports and 61% of imports by value.

In 2009 Lyttelton was awarded Category I Historic Area status by the Historic Places Trust (NZHPT) defined as "an area of special or outstanding historical or cultural heritage significance or value", not long before much of the historic fabric was destroyed in the 2011 Christchurch earthquake.

## Lyttelton Timeball Station

---

The **Lyttelton Timeball Station** is a heritage-registered time ball station and prominent local landmark in Lyttelton, New Zealand. The original station was significantly damaged by a series of earthquakes and aftershocks in 2010 and 2011, and finally collapsed on 13 June 2011 after a magnitude 6.4 aftershock. The tower was subsequently reconstructed, reopening in November 2018.

### Context

---

A time ball is a large painted wooden or metal ball that drops at a predetermined time, principally to enable sailors to check their marine chronometers from their boats offshore. While latitude has long been easily determined first using an astrolabe and later a sextant, timekeeping is one way of enabling mariners to determine their longitude at sea. The key to this was accuracy, as an error of four seconds translates into 6,000 feet (1,800 m) of actual distance at the equator, and 3,000 feet (910 m) at latitude 60 degrees.

## AIR NEW ZEALAND COMMEMORATIVE TOKEN

### OPENING AUCKLAND INTERNATIONAL Terminal

December 1977

Manukau has long been a transport hub. The land was farmed and then became a centre for aviation enthusiasts until secured in 1955 with the purpose of becoming the country's primary international airport.

On 29 January 1966, Auckland Airport was officially opened. The opening was commemorated with a 'Grand Air Pageant' held over three days, which attracted a crowd of over 200,000 members of the public.

In a booklet published to mark the occasion, Prime Minister Keith Holyoake wrote that the opening signified "Auckland's growing importance as a commercial centre and as a gateway to New Zealand."

At the time, all domestic and international flights used what is now the domestic terminal, until 1977 when a new international terminal was opened.

In the 1990s the airport nearly doubled in size after a \$180 million redevelopment project.

Since 1966, Auckland Airport has brought our island nation closer than ever to the rest of the world and become a key driver of New Zealand travel, trade and tourism.

Over the last fifty years, as our country and city have grown and changed, so have we.

We're a hub of economic growth, home to hundreds of local and global businesses where 30,000 people come to work every day.

Auckland Airport has always been more than a place of arrivals and departures. It's a place of hello and goodbye. Of kia ora and haera ra.

We're incredibly proud of the role that we play in connecting New Zealanders to the world, and encouraging visitors to our shores. We thank everyone in the community; our staff; the travelers; the airlines and all our partners for being a part of that.

## US 'Great White Fleet' arrives in Auckland

9 August 1908

---



Sixteen American battleships arrived in New Zealand with much pomp and ceremony.

A feature of the six-day 'fleet week' stopover was a civic reception attended by most of the members of the New Zealand Parliament, who had travelled north from Wellington aboard the 'Parliament Special' – the first train to traverse the whole length of the still-unfinished main trunk railway line (see 6 November).

The 'Great White Fleet' was a popular nickname for the US Navy battle fleet dispatched on a global tour by President Theodore Roosevelt to show off the United States' growing naval capability.

Between December 1907 and February 1909 the fleet covered nearly 70,000 km and visited 20 ports on six continents. It travelled down the east coast of South America and through the Straits of Magellan before arriving in San Francisco in May 1908. Leaving California on 7 July, it crossed the Pacific to Auckland.

After stopovers in Australia, the Great White Fleet visited the Philippines, Japan and China before returning to America's Atlantic coast via Ceylon (Sri Lanka), the Suez Canal and the Straits of Gibraltar.

## TAURANGA HARBOUR LINK STAGE 2

### History repeats at second Tauranga Harbour Crossing

Long serving Fletcher folk experienced déjà vu when we constructed the second Tauranga Harbour Crossing, because twenty years earlier we had built the original Tauranga Harbour Link, creating the first direct connection between Tauranga and Mount Maunganui.

But over those 20 years there was rapid population growth in the Bay of Plenty, so with 30,000 vehicles using it each day, major congestion and traffic delays demanded action.

We built a duplicate 466m long box-girder bridge parallel to the original bridge, a 550m long four-lane fly-over from the Harbour Bridge to Takitimu Drive and associated on and off-ramps. The 466m long bridge was incrementally launched in 20m sections that were constructed on the Tauranga side.

When the new bridge opened in December 2009, it significantly reduced congestion on the existing bridge, resulting in free flowing traffic once again.

#### Unique Aspects:

- Volunteers from the local community played key a role in the launch of the 12 bridge sections, helping to move the friction pads as the ever longer bridge was pushed towards Mount Maunganui using hydraulic jacks - 136 people donated 14 000 hours to help build the bridge.

The **Auckland War Memorial Museum Tāmaki Paenga Hira** (or simply the **Auckland Museum**) is one of New Zealand's most important museums and war memorials. Its collections concentrate on New Zealand history (and especially the history of the Auckland Region), natural history, and military history. The present museum building was constructed in the 1920s in the neo-classicist style, and sits on a grassed plinth (the remains of a dormant volcano) in the Auckland Domain, a large public park close to the Auckland CBD.

Auckland Museum's collections and exhibits began in 1852. In 1867 Aucklanders formed a learned society – the Auckland Philosophical Society, later the Auckland Institute. Within a few years the society merged with the museum and *Auckland Institute and Museum* was the organisation's name until 1996. Auckland War Memorial Museum was the name of the new building opened in 1929, but since 1996 was more commonly used for the institution as well. From 1991 to 2003 the museum's Māori-language name was *Te Papa Whakahiku*.

## Early history

The Auckland Museum traces its lineage back to 1852 when it was established in a farm workers' cottage on Princes Street in central Auckland, where the University of Auckland is now located. An announcement in newspapers in October of that year read:

THE object of this Museum is to collect Specimens illustrative of the Natural History of New Zealand—particularly its Geology, Mineralogy, Entomology, and Ornithology.

Also, Weapons, Clothing, Implements, &c., &c, of New Zealand, and the Islands of the Pacific. Any Memento of Captain Cook, or his Voyages will be thankfully accepted. Also, Coins and Medals (Ancient and Modern.) In connection with the above, there is an Industrial Museum, to exhibit—Specimens of:

building & ornamental Stone,  
Timber for various purposes  
Clays, Sands, &c., &c.,  
Dyes—Tanning substances, &c,  
Gums, Resins, &c.,  
Flax, Hemp, Hair, &c., &c.

As it is desirable that samples of New Zealand Wool should be exhibited—contributors are requested to send samples in duplicate, as soon as convenient, stating—the Sheep, where bred—of what breed—also the age—who contributed by. Donors are requested to send their contributions directed to the Honorary Secretary, at the Museum, any day in the week, except those open to the public.—Stating—the name of the contributor—where from—who contributed by—date—and any remarks that are considered necessary.

The Museum attracted 708 visitors in its first year. Interest in the museum dwindled over the following decade even as its collection grew, and in 1869 the somewhat neglected and forlorn museum was transferred to the care of the Auckland Institute, a learned society formed two years earlier. An Italianate-style building was constructed for the museum in Princes Street, near Government House and across the road from the Northern Club. It was opened on 5 June 1876 by the Governor of New Zealand, George Phipps, 2nd Marquess of Normanby. These new premises included a large gallery top-lit by a metal framed skylight. This room proved problematic as it was impossible to heat during the winter but overheated during the summer. Canvas awnings used to shield the roof from harsh sunlight made the exhibits difficult to see.

# National Army Museum (New Zealand)

The **National Army Museum** (Māori: *Te Mata Toa*) is the museum of the New Zealand Army. It was formerly known as the **Queen Elizabeth II Army Memorial Museum**. It is located on State Highway One, on the southern side of

the small military town of Waiouru. The 1300 square metre museum is fortress-looking in design, complete with a bridge and moat. It took the 2nd Field Squadron of the Royal New Zealand Engineers (RNZE) 276 days to build, and was opened in October 1978.

According to the museum's literature, it functions as a memorial to those who have fallen, to those who have served and are still serving, and to the battles fought by New Zealand soldiers. It is also a research, teaching and training facility of New Zealand's military history. Associated literature reveals "the museum serves as a place of connection between visitors and the nation's military past, a place where people can engage with real life stories and experiences and discover how these conflicts have shaped the nation".

The museum offers a number of facilities and experiences which include a gift shop, the Home Fires Café, the Kippenberger Research Library, and the Tears on Greenstone Memorial. On display are many and varied collections, including weapons, war memorabilia, military vehicles, exhibitions of battles (which mark anniversaries important in New Zealand's military history), a huge medal collection exhibiting medals associated with New Zealand and its army, and lifelike displays of twelve of the biggest campaigns that New Zealand troops have been involved in. "Kidz headquarters" provides children with fun learning activities.

## Tears on Greenstone

---

The Tears on Greenstone or Roimata Pounamu is a large wall made of greenstone. It serves as a memorial for the 30,000 plus service men and women who have sacrificed their lives for their country. The water cascading down the southern hemisphere's largest greenstone structure represents the tears of endless mourning, and is accompanied by an audio system reciting the names of the fallen. There is a touch screen near the Memorial where visitors can search for names of people lost in battle and hear those names read aloud.

**Mount Albert Grammar School**, commonly known as **MAGS**, is a co-educational state secondary school in Mount Albert in Auckland, New Zealand. It teaches students in year levels 9 to 13. As of August 2021, Mount Albert Grammar School is the second largest school in New Zealand, behind Rangitoto College.

## History

Mount Albert Grammar was founded in 1922 as a subsidiary of Auckland Grammar School, but now the two schools are governed separately. Mount Albert Grammar School was originally boys only, but became co-educational in 2000. Junior classes (years 9 and 10) are mostly single-sex while senior classes (years 11 to 13) are all co-educational.

There have been a number of headmasters since the opening of the school, Frederick Gamble (1922–1946), William Caradus (1946–1954), Murray Nairn (1954–1969), Maurice Hall (1970–1988), Gregory Taylor (1988–2006, the first Albertian to become Headmaster), Dale Burden (2006–2015), and the current headmaster, Patrick Drumm (2016–).

The school's hall was opened on 11 March 1926 by Sir James Parr after construction during 1925.

After the opening of the school, a need for boarding accommodation for students became apparent. In 1927, the Mount Albert Grammar School Hostel opened for boarders at 807 New North Road. This hostel closed in 1970 and a new one was opened in 1971, built on one of the school's playing fields. This is a boys' boarding hostel called School House. It has full-time accommodation for up to 105 students during school terms.

The School's Latin motto is *Per Angusta Ad Augusta*, which means "Through Hardship to Glory". The school hymn, sung at all formal assemblies, was written by a student, J. A. W. Bennett, in 1928.

In October 2015, an email containing a pornographic image was sent to all the school's 2,700 students after the school's email database was reportedly hacked by one of the school's students. The email database was immediately shut down and an investigation was started into who was responsible. The school laid a complaint with police and sought the assistance of the Department of Internal Affairs.

The school purchased what was meant to be a girls' hostel, but due to the Auckland housing crisis turned into accommodation for teachers. The complex is located 6 minute walk away from MAGS on Lloyd Avenue.

On July 24, 2020, Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern officially opened the school's new science block, known as CS block and honouring the school's second headmaster, William Caradus. This was set to take place on March 24, however was postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The block has been in use since classes commenced for the 2020 school year.

Karl Pallo was born at Reinu, Pärnu, Estonia, then part of the Russian empire, on 17 February 1896, the son of Henry Pallo, an engineer, and his wife, Anna Martinson. His father acquired interests in a generator factory in Riga, Latvia, and a horse-drawn carriage firm, as well as an estate with its own mills. Karl was brought up in the Baltic provinces and from 1907 lived in St Petersburg. While studying engineering, he was conscripted around 1915 into the Russian army, attaining the rank of lieutenant during the First World War. He returned to Estonia in 1921 and worked as an importer.

In 1924 Pallo moved to Paris, where he got a drawing-office job in the shipbuilding industry. He observed advanced manufacturing methods and went on trial voyages between Le Havre and New York on the liner *Île de France*. By 1927 he was in Sydney, working as an engineer for SATAM, a French firm of petrol-pump

manufacturers supplying fuel to airports. Sent to open a branch in Wellington, he arrived on the *Maunganui* on 12 February 1929, and was to live in New Zealand the rest of his life.

The first fuel pump Karl Pallo installed was in 1929 at the Marlborough Aero Club, and he later provided Wellington's Rongotai aerodrome with portable fuelling equipment. He obtained sole agency for importing the French petrol pumps and by March 1930, under the name Pallo Limited, was testing them at premises in Wakefield Street, Wellington. Soon after, the company began to manufacture British-designed petrol pumps. Its works site was connected by an alley to its Courtenay Place office, on the first floor of the Stewart Building; it eventually took over the whole floor.

The depression years were difficult, and in August 1931 one of his motor garage customers was declared bankrupt; Pallo Limited was a secured creditor. Pallo pumps were first exhibited in September that year, probably at the Wellington Winter Show and Industrial Exhibition, and the firm joined the Wellington Manufacturers' Association. In August 1932 he filed a patent application (the first of many) for a 'liquid measuring device', and the following July he patented a petrol pump.

Tall, blond and broad-shouldered, Karl Pallo was an animated, determined man who spoke with a slight accent. On 11 February 1933, at a Lutheran church in Sydney, he married Latvian-born Felicitas Maria Birnstein, the daughter of a factory director. The couple were to have two daughters and a son.

Pallo decided to manufacture an electric petrol pump of his own design, the 'Palometer', which was widely used at bowser stations and country stores. Of great precision and complexity, the pumps had an innovative dial that showed the amount of petrol delivered. They were pictured on some of the Shell Petroleum Company's New Zealand road maps. In September 1934 he again visited Australia, where he met with oil company representatives. The following January the newly registered Pallo Engineering Limited had 22 employees and by September 1935 there were 98 on the payroll. The first apprentice he took on was Dick Light, who later became a foreman. By 1937 six women were working in cog-making and parts assembly, occupying their own room at the works. That year a sports club for the apprentices and tennis courts were planned.

A strong advocate of technical education, Karl Pallo was a member of Wellington Technical College's Mechanical Engineers Advisory Committee for more than 20 years and manufacturers' representative on the Standards Council (1938-60); from 1958 to 1960 he was president of the New Zealand Manufacturing Engineers and Metal Trades' Federation. During the Second World War the company's production switched to munitions and the number of female staff greatly increased. In 1946, having established Die Castings Limited, Pallo set up a foundry at Bell Road, Gracefield, in the Hutt Valley industrial zone. This produced parts for his 'Pallo' electric washing machine, which featured a pump, safety wringer and agitator. In 1962 Karl Pallo sold his business to Sunbeam New Zealand. About 1970 he and his wife retired to Taupo, where he died on 7 October 1986, aged 90. He was survived by his wife and children.

Following the break-up of the Partnership Thomas William Garrett joined the business and the following year replaced Parton as Osborne's associate, the business became Osborne & Garrett.

Following the break-up of the partnership a new business emerged, Parton Sons and Co.

In 1890's and Ltd added in 1901. Hence the PS&Co. ( **Ogee** later issue)

# New Zealand International Exhibition 1906

1247

The New Zealand International Exhibition was held in Christchurch from 1 November 1906 to 15 April 1907.

It was the brainchild of Richard Seddon, Premier of New Zealand from 1893 until his death on 10 June 1906, just a few months before the Exhibition opened.



Despite the substantial financial loss incurred by the Exhibition, it was deemed to be a success. With nearly 2 million visitors, attendance exceeded expectations - New Zealand's total population at the time was less than 1 million.

The **New Zealand International Exhibition** (the biggest in the country to that time) opened on 1 November 1906 in Hagley Park, Christchurch, New Zealand. Nearly two million people visited the exhibition during the next few months. A 90 chains (1,800 m) branch railway line was built in late 1905 across North Hagley Park starting at the Riccarton station to service the exhibition (goods traffic only) and a temporary tram line was built in Peterborough Street, Park Terrace and Salisbury Street to connect with the Victoria Street tram. The attractions included New Zealand's first professional symphony orchestra (conducted by Alfred Hill), and the first Dominion pipe band contest, which was won by the Dunedin Highland Pipe Band.

Amusements included a water chute on Victoria Lake, a dragon train, a toboggan course, a helter-skelter and a gondola. The Pike featured penny in the slot machines, a maze, and Professor Renno and his Palace of Illusions.

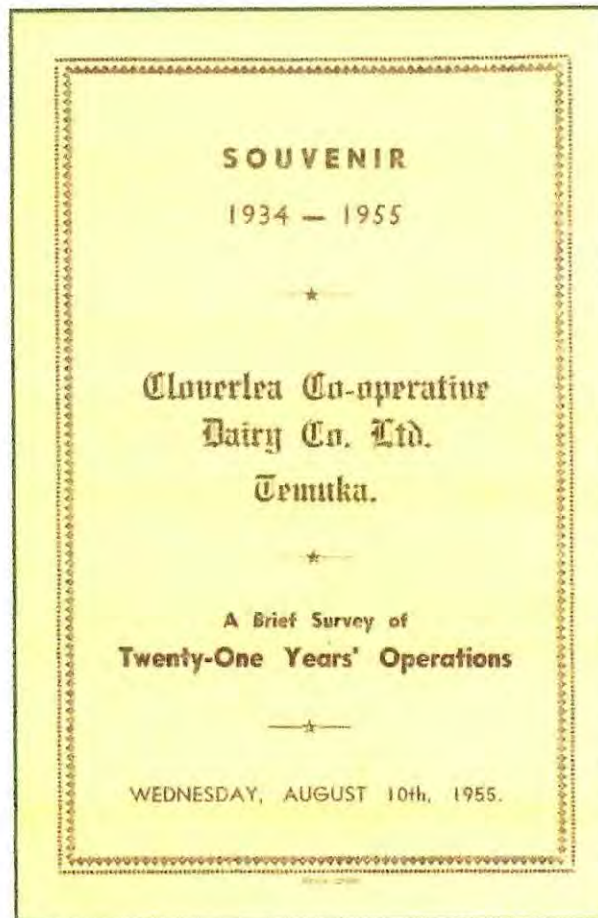

## The history of St John in New Zealand

ABOUT HISTORY IN NEW ZEALAND

*St John has been helping Kiwis since 1885, when a reverend and a doctor collaborated to get St John started here.*

### The history of St John in New Zealand

Established in New Zealand since 1885, St John has grown to become one of the largest civilian service organisations in the country. Our mission today is the same as it was back then – to prevent and relieve sickness and injury, and to enhance the health and well-being of all New Zealanders.

#### A colony in need of a first aid service

New Zealand in the 1880s wasn't a good place to have an accident or to get ill suddenly. Even though people were highly susceptible to injury because they were mostly doing manual jobs, medical services were scant.

In April 1885 at a public meeting in St Mary's Church, Christchurch, Reverend Thomas Flavell and Dr Walter Hacon proposed that the St John Ambulance Association be introduced to the colony. Their initiative led to the rapid establishment of St John throughout New Zealand.

In 1892 the first St John Ambulance Brigade was formed in Dunedin; in 1895 the first St John Nursing Division was established, also in Dunedin; and by 1905, nearly half of the St John divisions outside the United Kingdom were in New Zealand. Since those early milestones, St John has grown and evolved rapidly to become the well-known organisation it is today.

#### From the Ashford litter to state-of-the-art ambulances

Patient transport has always been a core service provided by St John. The first ambulance vehicle in New Zealand was 'the Ashford litter' – a simple, two-wheeled cart that was pushed along the road by four men. Today St John provides emergency and non-emergency ambulance services for approximately 90% of New Zealand's population – activity that involves state-of-the-art ambulances, four-wheel drive vehicles, motorcycles and other specialist vehicles.

#### The spirit of volunteering

In New Zealand volunteering for St John has always been a noble pastime, because the services we provide benefit everyone. The volunteers of the late 1800s got involved by raising funds, attending first aid lectures and helping with the administration of the organisation – three areas of volunteer commitment that remain popular to this day.

Volunteers were also keen to learn first aid and pass examinations which would allow them to wear the coveted 'St John medallion'. When first aid training was in its infancy, New Zealand newspapers enthusiastically published reports of successful treatments by first aiders, as well as lists of those who had earned medallion status.

#### Helping out during and after the war

During World War II, St John volunteers supported the Air Raid Precautions Scheme in New Zealand. They made and rolled bandages and dressings, taught first aid at mass public classes and worked at medical centres. Many St John volunteers also served overseas with the New Zealand Military forces.

Following the war, St John established mobile clinics and provided an efficient blood collection service. St John in New Zealand was also elevated to a Priory in 1946, giving it greater autonomy and influence.

#### New Zealand's first telethon aids St John

In the mid 1970s, ambulance personnel were encouraged to obtain formal medical qualifications. The day of an ambulance travelling at breakneck speed with patients tended by personnel holding only basic first aid certificates was over.

To help lift the skills levels of ambulance staff, New Zealand's first Telethon raised more than half a million dollars to establish a national ambulance training centre. In the same year St John ambulances travelled 2.815 million miles, were crewed by 1,120 personnel and carried 251,000 patients.

#### New services for the new millennium

Since the year 2000, St John has consolidated and reorganised the structure used to provide services. Our core activities continue to be ambulance services, first aid training and public first aid. We have added to our service offering as new needs emerged – *Caring Caller*, *ASB St John in Schools* and *Friends of the Emergency Department*, *Health Shuttles*, *St John Opportunity Shops*, *Medical Alarms* and the *St John Youth programme*.

## Lodges of Southern New Zealand

Friendly Societies were set up mainly to provide insurance-related benefits for members and their families. These included benefits payable on sickness, annuities in old age, funeral benefits, life insurance and medical benefits.

**L**ODGES were governed by the Friendly Societies Act which came into force from 1 January 1878 and covered those societies which already existed, but specified that all societies must have a minimum of seven members. Persons under the age of 21 but above the age of 16 could be members, and branches that consisted solely of members of any age under 16 years but exceeding three years could be registered under the Act.

All the following orders are Friendly Societies with the exception of: Antient, Free and Accepted Masons; Cheong Shing Tong; Co-Masonry; Loyal Orange Lodge; Order of the Eastern Star; Royal Antediluvian Order of Buffaloes.

The following orders have been established south of the Waitaki River since the founding of Otago in 1848. The approximate number of lodges in this area enrolled under each order is shown, making a total as known to date of 1038 lodges.

### **Antient, Free and Accepted Masons**

English Freemasonry started in England before 1717, the date that English Grand Lodge was formed. The earliest record of a Scottish lodge is December 1598 with Scottish Grand Lodge formed in 1726, its headquarters being at Kilwinning in Ayrshire. Irish lodges were operating before 1710 with their Grand Lodge formed in 1725.

The first Masonic lodge in Otago was The Lodge of Otago, No. 844, an English Constitution lodge, on 8 August 1860 followed by the first Scottish lodge on 4 November 1861 and the first Irish lodge on 29 March 1866. The New Zealand Constitution was formed in 1890 and many lodges from the other three constitutions transferred over to the new one. Total lodges = 175.

In 1999 a private organisation, the Chatham Islands Note Corporation, issued banknotes to celebrate the Chatham Islands being the first human-inhabited land to enter the third millennium. Banknotes such as these cannot be declared legal tender, and there is no obligation for anyone to accept the notes issued by the Chatham Island Note Corporation in any transaction. These notes were reported to have been accepted by merchants on the Chatham Islands, some of whom served as directors of the issuer.

The Chatham Islands Note Corporation was initially based in Christchurch. The agent for providing the notes to the numismatic trade was Leon Morel, Fellow of the Royal Numismatic Society of New Zealand of Melbourne, Victoria. The corporation later shifted their base of operations to Waitangi.

The face value of the notes was pegged at the same rate as the New Zealand dollar. They are unusual in that the first series included \$3 and \$15 dollar notes, while the second series includes an \$8 note.

The British General Electric Co., Ltd., Wellington, installed the exchange equipment, electric light fittings, etc.

The Enfield Cable Works (A/sia) Ltd., Wellington, supplied electric cables and copper wire, etc., for the electrification.

Richardson, McCabe and Co., Ltd., supplied electric cable, switchgear, etc.

James Gibson, of 32 Allen Street, Wellington, attended to the electric light and power for the station.

In the early 20th century, the Post and Telegraph Department, one of the country's largest employers, was at the cutting edge of technological and social change. The reach of the 'P & T' extended throughout the Dominion, and it was to stretch even further after war broke out in August 1914.

## Postal people

In March 1914 the Post and Telegraph Department had 5637 'classified' (permanent) staff – more than the rest of the public service put together – and a total of almost 8000 employees. This was a large organisation in a country with fewer than half a million paid workers.

### A public service

'The Post and Telegraph Department is really a "Service" rather than a "Department". By reason of its ramifications, it has probably greater potentialities for usefulness to the public than any other organization, and in New Zealand very full use is made of it.'

The P & T was second in size only to the Railways Department – not part of the public service – which had more than 14,000 on its payroll. The work of the 2306 country postmasters and postmistresses extended even further into the backblocks than did the railway network.

Specialised vocational training was important for the P & T. Several hundred staff took correspondence courses in telegraphy and telephony each year, and a handful of engineering officers studied physics at Victoria University College in Wellington. Young cadet telegraphists lived and worked in healthy Oamaru, away from big-city temptations. But the department struggled to hold onto the 50 telegraphists it turned out each year. Some soon went to sea as wireless operators, while others were lured to Australia by higher salaries. Young male staff also learned shorthand and typewriting, which was not then seen as women's work.

## Joseph Ward's legacy

In 1914 the Post and Telegraph Department bore the firm imprint of Sir Joseph Ward, who had been postmaster-general and minister in charge of the telegraph system in the centre-left Liberal government for most of its existence (1891–1912),

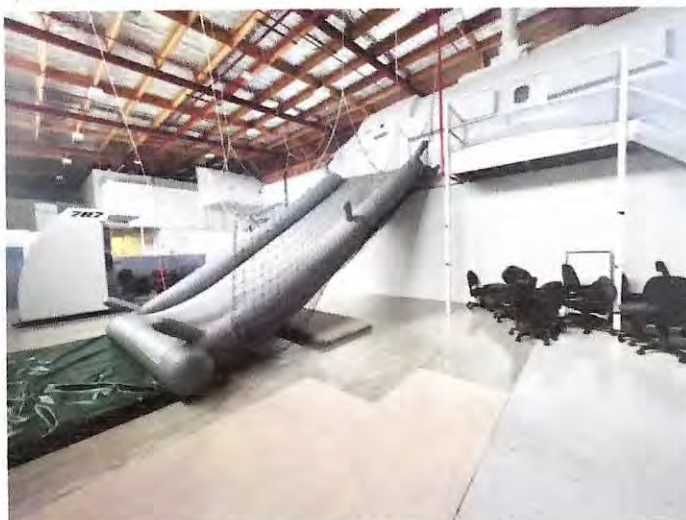

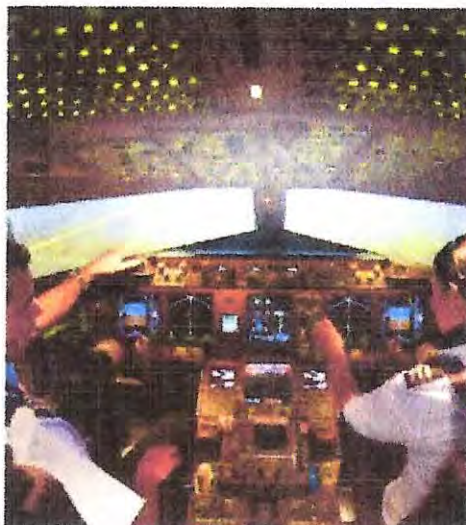

**Z Energy** is a New Zealand fuel distributor with branded service stations. It comprises some of the former assets of Shell New Zealand and Chevron New Zealand. Shell left the New Zealand fuel distribution business in April 2010, selling its operations to Infratil and New Zealand Superannuation Fund. The former Shell operations were rebranded as Z Energy in 2011. Since May 2022, it is a subsidiary of Australian petroleum company Ampol.

It operates under the Z Energy and Caltex New Zealand brands. There are 227 Z Energy service stations around New Zealand, including 60 in Auckland. There are also 138 Caltex sites, including 39 in Auckland.

## Background

Shell withdrew from the fuel distribution market in New Zealand in 2010. Shell's New Zealand assets, including a 17.1% stake in Refining NZ, were acquired by Infratil and the New Zealand Superannuation Fund for \$891 million. However the Taranaki based exploration and production division were not part of this sale portfolio.

Z Energy currently competes with BP, ExxonMobil subsidiary Mobil NZ and several smaller independent groups such as Gull New Zealand. Former competitors included Chevron's New Zealand subsidiary Caltex which Z Energy acquired in June 2016.

## Founding

In 2010 the branding remained as Shell whereas the holding company was renamed from Shell NZ to Greenstone Energy. After surveying 17,000 customers the following year, the company changed its name to Z Energy Limited and branded the service stations as Z.

### Z Energy is an Oil Company Petrol Stations.

These plastic tokens / counters were used in promotions, for Charity fund raising at their service stations. When you purchased fuel you were given a token.

You could put it in a receptacle of your choice, at the service station, ie St. John, Hopea home. At the end of the promotion they would give a Charity the money based on how many tokens they got.

Cornerstone Christian School is an integrated co-educational Area School (combined Primary and Secondary) for Years 1–13 in the city of Palmerston North, New Zealand. The school is divided by an administrative block between the junior and senior areas, after the senior area the newly installed intermediate block is situated.

The school is located on the intersection of Mihaere Drive, and Roberts line in the suburb of Kelvin Grove, Palmerston North.

## The Cornerstone positive behaviour rewards (PB4L) model

At Cornerstone Christian School, we use a token economy in conjunction with the online programme and phone app, 'Class Dojo', to reward positive behaviour.

Every teacher in the school is allocated tokens each fortnight to give to students as our 'free and frequent' reward when we acknowledge students showing our school values; respect, integrity, kindness, diligence and humility before God.

In Years 7-13, they are the purple Tuakiri (identity) tokens. We use the word tuakiri (identity) to acknowledge that when we encourage students to practice our values, we are helping students to fulfill their identity in Christ.

In Years 1 – 6, students are awarded specifically coloured tokens according to the value that they are showing at break times. Classroom teachers also use Class Dojo for individual rewards in class.

## Rewards

In years 1 – 6, individual teams decide on prizes/rewards to be given out to individual students for their Class Dojo points. The coloured value tokens earned at break times are placed by students in a class container. When the tokens get to a certain height, the whole class gets a reward decided by the teacher and class together.

In years 7 – 13, student 'cash in' their tokens on a weekly basis on Wednesdays where their totals are recorded. At this time, they can order a reward which is delivered to students at interval on Fridays. Totals are also kept for tribes which will contribute to tribe points at the end of the year.

# New Zealand. Government Life Insurance Office

# St Patrick's College, Kilbirnie, Wellington

**St Patrick's College** is a Roman Catholic boys' secondary school in New Zealand.

## History



Founded by Archbishop Francis Redwood SM, St Patrick's opened on 1 June 1885 with nine day-boys and twelve boarders.

The College represents one of the earliest educational establishments of the Society of Mary (Marists), the religious congregation whose members accompanied Bishop Jean Baptiste Pompallier to New Zealand in 1838, and who played a prominent role in the establishment of the Catholic church in New Zealand.

The first members of staff, Irish Marists who came principally from the Marist College at Dundalk, established a number of Marist colleges such as St Bede's College, Christchurch and St John's College, Hastings in New Zealand.

Plans in 1929 envisaged the College moving to a more suitable site at Silverstream in the Hutt Valley, but a high demand for education eventually led to a split in 1931: the original establishment continued and the boarding section moved to become St Patrick's College, Silverstream, thus allowing room for the expansion of day-student numbers on the Cambridge Terrace site in central Wellington city.

From that time the city college has borne the nickname "St Pat's Town". The two separate Colleges bearing the same name have developed a shared history and a healthy rivalry: they share the St Patrick's College Old Boy's Association also. In 1979, St Patrick's College shifted from its Cambridge Terrace site to a new facility near Kilbirnie Park in Evans Bay.

**Tāmaki Makaurau** is a New Zealand parliamentary Māori electorate returning one Member of Parliament to the New Zealand House of Representatives. It was first formed for the 2002 election. The electorate covers the Auckland area and was first held by Labour's John Tamihere before going to Dr Pita Sharples of the Māori Party for three terms from 2005 to 2014. After Sharples' retirement, the electorate was won by Peeni Henare of the Labour Party in the 2014 election.

It derives its name from the Māori-language name for Auckland; *Makaurau* is a descriptive epithet referring to the value and desirability of the land.

## Population centres

In its current boundaries, Tāmaki Makaurau contains the west coast of the Auckland Region between Te Henga / Bethells Beach and the mouth of the Manukau Harbour, all of West Auckland south of Te Atatū, the entire Auckland isthmus, and the South Auckland suburbs of Māngere, Ōtara, Pakuranga and Manurewa. It does not contain Great Barrier or Rangitoto islands, as they are in Te Tai Tokerau; Papakura is in Hauraki-Waikato.

In the review of boundaries in 2007, the southern part of Manurewa shifted from Tāmaki Makaurau to the Hauraki-Waikato electorate. The 2013/14 redistribution did not further alter the boundaries of the electorate, but the 2020 boundary review made small expansions for Tāmaki Makaurau to the electorate's north and south, as well as incorporating the islands Waiheke and Ponui. To the north, Glendene and Te Atatū South are now included, while the southern portion now incorporates Flat Bush and Takanini.

## Tribal areas

The main iwi of Tāmaki Makaurau are Ngāti Whātua, Kawerau a Maki, Tainui, Ngāti Pāoa, Wai-O-Hua and Ngāti Rehua, though a pan-Māori organisation called Ngāti Akarana exists for urbanised Māori with no knowledge of their actual iwi; and, through a population trend whereby many rural Māori moved to the cities, the largest iwi affiliation in the seat are Ngāpuhi, Ngāti Porou, Waikato and Ngāti Maniapoto, all iwi local to other areas of New Zealand.

## History

*Tāmaki Makaurau* derives its name from the Māori-language name for Auckland, meaning "Tāmaki desired by many", in reference to the desirability of its natural resources and geography.

Tāmaki Makaurau was formed for the 2002 election from the northern part of the Hauraki electorate. John Tamihere of the Labour Party was the representative for Hauraki, and he also won the first election in the Tāmaki Makaurau electorate in 2002. Tamihere spent his six-year parliamentary career dogged by controversy that often overshadowed his work as a minister and, at the 2005 election came ten percent behind Māori Party co-leader Pita Sharples. Because Tamihere had chosen not to seek a list placing, his parliamentary career was terminated. Sharples remained the current representative for the electorate until his retirement, when the Labour's Peeni Henare won the seat.

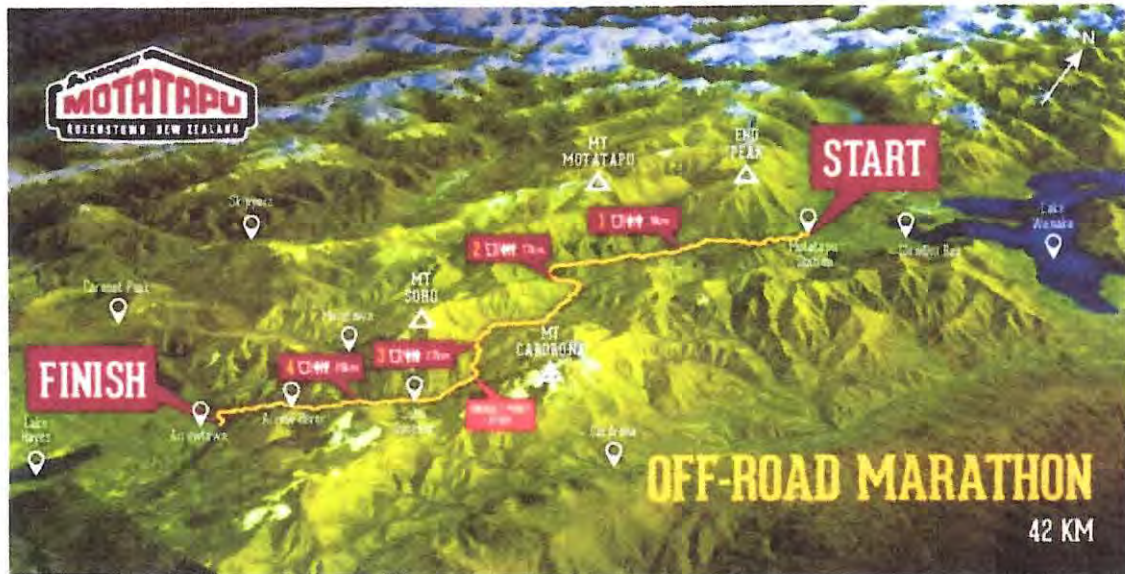

# A silver slice of Māori history: the Te Pahi medal

The sudden reappearance and subsequent sale by Sotheby's Australia of the Te Pahi medal in April 2014 was a significant numismatic event. The medal is a unique object in early Australasian colonial history.

The circumstances of its presentation by the Governor of New South Wales, Philip Gidley King, to Te Pahi, a Ngāpuhi chief, provide insights into colonial and indigenous contacts and relationships in the early 1800s.

This paper considers the circumstances behind the commissioning of the medal in 1805–06 and its disappearance following colonist and whaler raids in 1810. When the medal reappeared, Ngāpuhi demanded its repatriation and attempted to have its sale postponed. Although this proved unsuccessful, the medal was repatriated thanks to a winning bid jointly made by the Museum of New Zealand Te Papa Tongarewa and the Auckland War Memorial Museum Tāmaki Paenga Hira. At the time of writing, the Te Pahi medal has just returned to New Zealand after an absence of more than 200 years.

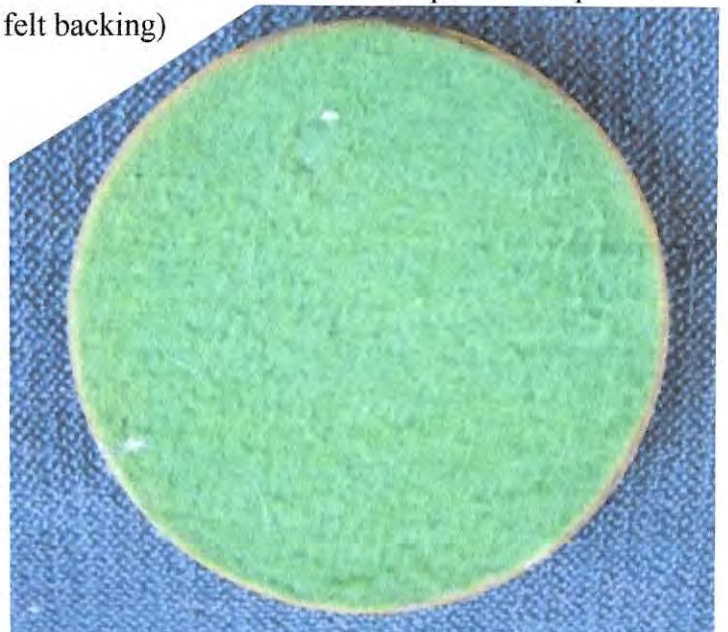

# 1990 Eisenhower Trophy

1337

The **1990 Eisenhower Trophy** took place 25 to 28 October at the Christchurch Golf Club near Christchurch, New Zealand. It was the 17th World Amateur Team Championship for the Eisenhower Trophy. The tournament was a 72-hole stroke play team event with 33 four-man teams. The best three scores for each round counted towards the team total.

Sweden won the Eisenhower Trophy for the first time, finishing 13 strokes ahead of the joint silver medalists, New Zealand and United States with Canada, France and Japan tied for fourth place. Mathias Grönberg had the lowest individual score, 2-under-par 286, six strokes better than fellow-Swede Gabriel Hjertstedt.

## ExxonMobil

Mobil is the oldest oil company in New Zealand. Its kerosene first appeared in the country under the Standard Oil brand in the 1870s. Early in 1896, Vacuum Oil of New York established a marketing office on Featherston Street in Wellington selling lamp oil and harness grease. It brought with it extensive collective production, marketing and management skills that presented a major advancement in business organisation. The company's unrivaled mineral lubricant products and associated services quickly dominated the market.

When New Zealanders began taking to the motorcar in the early twentieth century, Vacuum Oil expanded into the oil refining business. Its marketing network and transportation fleet grew as it extended its range of operation. The company continued to meet New Zealand's fuel needs throughout World War One, holding roughly 85 percent of the market. After the war, Vacuum Oil began facing very strong competition, with a number of multinational oil companies which establishing operations in New Zealand. Among these competitors was the Atlantic Union Oil Company, another of the companies from which ExxonMobil is descended.

Atlantic Union was bought by the New Jersey-based Standard Oil Company, which would later become Exxon, and its eastern hemisphere interests were merged with those of Socony-Vacuum Oil Company to create the Standard-Vacuum Oil Company. The new company continued operations in New Zealand under both the Vacuum and Atlantic Union brand names.

On November 30, 1999, Exxon Corporation and Mobil Oil Corporation merged with Mobil Oil New Zealand Limited now owned by new entity ExxonMobil. The company currently owns a 17.2 percent share in The New Zealand Refining Company Limited which operates an oil refinery at Marsden Point. It supplies roughly 20 percent of the total fuels market in New Zealand, for which most of its products are sourced from the Marsden Point refinery. Mobil Oil New Zealand Limited has more than 150 locations across the country, some of which are franchisee-owned. It also operates six storage locations across the country and maintains a reputation as a dominant petroleum company in New Zealand.

Mobil New Zealand has 167 stations as of 2022, including 68 in Auckland. Its stations included 121 company-owned and 46 franchisee-owned outlets.
